Today's Sermon

"Marriage from a Biblical Perspective"

"Haven't you read," he replied, "that he who created them in the beginning made them male and female, and he also said, 'For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two will become one flesh'? So they are no longer two, but one flesh. Therefore, what God has joined together, let no one separate." - Matthew 19:4-6 (CSB)

Wives, submit, to your husbands as to the Lord, because the husband is the head of the wife as Christ is the head of the church. He is the Savior of the body. Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives are to submit to their husbands in everything. Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself for her to make her holy, cleansing her with the washing of water by the word. He did this to present the church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or anything like that, but holy and blameless. In the same way, husbands are to love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. For no one ever hates his own flesh but provides and cares for it, just as Christ does for the church, since we are members of his body. For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two will become one flesh. This mystery is profound, but I am talking about Christ and the church. To sum up, each one of you is to love his wife as himself, and the wife is to respect her husband. - Ephesians 5:22-33 (CSB)

Farewell From Bob & Desley Haigh

As you all know, since July 2019 our lives have been turned upside down with the diagnosis of terminal Pancreatic Cancer of our daughter, Monika Curtis. Through this time, there have been many ups and downs – the ups when Mon managed to surprise all the Doctors with outcomes of her treatment, and the downs when we have had to watch her in excruciating pain, and then when at Xmas time she almost lost her life, not to the cancer, but due to a perforation of her bowel, probably caused by Chemo Treatment. She dug her heals in and refused the surgery which all the Doctors said she must have in order for her to survive. She came through that without having the surgery, to the amazement of the Doctors. Mon knows her survival was nothing to do with the medical treatment, because the surgical team told her that without surgery she had no hope of surviving, yet each day they found an improvement in her condition. We have an amazing Father.

Mon has asked me to say a very heart felt thank you to our Church Family at Tin Can Bay Community Church, for their continuing prayers and interest in her welfare throughout the past 19 months. She has felt supported by people she doesn't know, and we, her family would also like to thank you all for uplifting Mon and all our family up in prayer throughout this difficult time. God has answered our prayers, and Mon has been given extra time with us. Bobby and I would have liked to thank each one personally, and had wanted to stand up at Church and thank you all, but it is a very emotional time for us, and as you know, we can only just hold it all together each Sunday when we are asked how she is going.

We are moving to North Lakes on Monday 22nd, and will be much closer to Mon and to our other daughter and son. We have always felt nurtured by our friends here at Tin Can Bay and Cooloola Cove, and had no intentions of ever leaving, but it is the right time for us to be closer to all our family. Mon is battling each day, and hopefully will be given a bed at the QE11 Palliative Care unit as soon as one becomes available, so they can adjust her medications and control her pain, and she can be discharged relatively pain free at this point in her journey.

We hope to be able to visit from time to time, so it's not a true goodbye, but we will always hold a special place in our hearts for this Church Family. Thank you all for your support from our first visit in November 2015, when we had 3 invitations on that first Sunday to go to afternoon tea. The warm welcome and hospitality made us feel right at home from the start.

We will be regularly keeping in touch with some members and I'm sure they will pass on any information of importance that they receive from us.

We pray that God will continue to bless the work being done in this community, and to bring new people to worship, and that the Church will flourish and continue to be a great Lighthouse in the area.
