Radiance

(by John D Barry - Connect The Testaments Daily Devotional)

When I was a boy, my dad took me to his construction site, and told me, "Don't look directly at the welding light; it can blind you." But a welding flame is cool and dangerous. As my father was talking with the foreman, I fixated on the light. I saw spots for the rest of the evening, but didn't tell anyone. I secretly feared that the radiance had actually blinded me.

The radiance of Christ is blinding — it was for Paul (Acts 9:1–31). In an epic hymn about the work of God's Son throughout history, the author of Hebrews calls Jesus "the radiance of [God's] glory and the representation of his essence, sustaining all things by the word of power" (Heb 1:3). It's easy to wonder if sustainability is possible, if the world will one day crumble and fall. But in Christ, there is hope.

Jesus is much like the sun. You don't always notice its power, warmth, or even that it's there. That is especially the case for the cloudy days. We forget that without the sun, there would be no life. It's easy to forget that it is warming us even through rain and clouds.

The same is true for Jesus in our lives. It's easy to forget Him until we desperately need Him. It's easy to overlook the daily miracles, such as life itself, when searching for something extraordinary. But the extraordinary is always present. It's here in the work of Christ, every day. His radiance shines upon us, even when we don't realize it.

Pray For Myanmar

A couple of weeks ago we had Simon Rattray from Project114 share the message with us during our morning service. The ministry's vision is to see isolated and vulnerable believers empowered with practical tools for spiritual and financial sustainability. They specifically work with families and communities who have been touched by persecution, crisis, war and displacement.

Simon has forwarded an update from Silas, their Country Care Coordinator in Myanmar.

The Situation

The political party of Aung San Suu Kyi won the recent election for the second time by 83% and yesterday should have been the first session of Parliament where formation of the new government team for the new term to take place.

However, the opposing party and military alleged electoral fraud. There were mass demonstrations in Yangon in the last 4 days opposing the election result and winning party while supporting the military interference. It was mentioned at a press conference by the military and a video conference with senior military generals last week that military seizure of power could happen. Now, it has happened unfortunately.

Suu Kyi and other top civilian leaders were taken into custody along with famous writers and social bloggers. Since late midnight last night, phone line and internet services are cut country wide. And all TV channels stopped except a military channel announcing military coup for a year.

As a result, things as mentioned below happened.

- 1. Internet services resume only by late afternoon Tuesday while phone lines have still been banned.
- 2. Internet services are also not available depending on country and city parts.
- 3. Banks issued official announced that both on-site and digital bank services will not be available for some time.
- 4. Many companies especially in Yangon and Mandalay let their staff go back home today.
- 5. Panic buying happens and commodity price mounts up today.
- 6. In some parts of cities and towns the armed forces are not allowing freedom of movement, installing a 8pm to 6am curfew, threatening to shoot dissenters.

How To Pray

- Please pray the coup will end and that the military will be committed to the democratic process.
- Pray the curfew and the limitations of movement will not adversely affect the work that Silas is doing with us on the trauma recovery project.
- Silas has asked that we pray for believers in Myanmar that they would not make things worse by criticising the military on social media but that God's people there would remember God is in control (Romans 13:1b). That they would pray for those in authority (1 Timothy 2:2).
- Pray keep Silas and all God's people there in your personal, family and team prayers for wisdom, protection and continuous impact.
- Pray that Silas will continue to be faithful and maintain courage as he serves the most vulnerable of God's people in his country during this time.



Prayer Requests

A few months ago Heather Goodall was appointed to the role of Pastoral Care Coordinator which included responsibility for the Prayer Chain.

Her role with prayer requests is to receive prayer requests from church members – or even from within the community should such a request arise.

She will then disseminate the prayer requests to those members on the prayer chain – any member
